Update on Actions Taken Since Last Report:

It was determined that Student Health Services will report to the Vice President of Texas A&M Health. Jason Jennings and Linda Clark from Baylor Scott & White attended a portion of our meeting and described their integrated healthcare model.

Next Major Issue to be Addressed:

Determine how to build a new, truly integrated healthcare model/facility, incorporating all areas of student health. Identify the role of clinical primary care, mental health care, and student health care. Invite the academic programs, including Nursing, Pharmacy, and Medicine (including Psychiatry), to the future meetings and have them present their vision for an integrated healthcare model and how they will participate. Reach out to CHI/St. Joseph to discuss their model.

Problems or Barriers Encountered and Solutions Identified:

Look at possible locations that could accommodate providing future healthcare services in one location, considering locations that are accessible to the largest number of the students. Look at building a clinic on the edge of campus, in addition to possibly a small satellite clinic in the center of campus. The center of campus must be defined due to the recent enrollment growth. We must also look at the provision of healthcare services at our off-campus locations - how do we expand the model beyond Bryan/College Station? What will the model look like over the next 2-5 years – both organizational structure and business model? We should look at a health plan in the future that will also provide service to TAMU faculty and staff.

Deliverables Completed:

Identified reporting structure for the new integrated Student Health Services. TAMU Health organizational chart was distributed.

Timeline for Completion of Remaining Deliverables:

March 23rd meeting – Academic programs will attend the working group meeting to discuss integration models and how they can participate.
